## American Heart Association Course Prerequisites

To attend an ACLS class you must be proficient and understand ECG interpretation, emergency pharmacology, the 10 ACLS core cases and the ACLS algorithms before class. In addition, you must have an AHA BLS for Healthcare Providers' card (Dated July 1, 2006 or later that meets the 2005 ECC guidelines) or have proficiency in basic life support and without prompting be able to perform high-quality CPR and use an AED according to the 2005 ECC Guidelines (Effective July 1, 2006). Each student must also complete the Precourse Self-Assessment Test that's located on the CD-ROM inside your course textbook. Once you complete the test, score your answer sheet and bring it with you to class. You must give your scored Precourse Self-Assessment Test answer sheet and this original signed Learning Contract to the Lead Instructor before class starts. If you cannot access the CD-ROM's features, you may complete and score the Written Precourse Self-Assessment that's provided in your study packet.
